

FIVE YEAR INTEGRATED LAW COURSE

The college has been running 5 year Integrated Law Course from the academic session 2002-2003. Already five batches admitted to the course are undergoing the training. This will be the 7th batch to be admitted for session 2009-10.

ELIGIBILITY

For admission to the 5 years Integrated Law Course a candidate must have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) examination from J&K Board of School Education or an examination of any other Board recognised as equivalent thereto with not less than 45% marks (40% in case of Schedule Caste/Schedule Tribe candidates).

SEATS

- ✱ The college is permitted to admit 80 students to 5 year Integrated Law Course.
- ✱ As per the statutes governing the admission to 5 years Integrated Law Course of University of Jammu, the following is the break up :-

(A) Open Merit Seats

Sixty-Seven percent (67%) of the number of seats available in the course of study shall be filled up on the basis of open merit.

(B) Reserved category seats

After selection of candidate is made on the basis of open merit, the remaining thirty three percent (33%) seats, notwithstanding anything contrary in any Law, S.R.O. or Regulation in force in the state, shall be filled up from the candidates belonging to the following reserved categories as per break up given below :-

Note : 1. Candidate Seeking admission under the categories sports, cultural literary activities, NCC & NSS is required to fill a separate form which shall be available from the Law Office. To be a beneficiary of reservation, the candidate must be a permanent resident of J&K State, except when applying under categories (ii) i.e. sports/cultural and literary activities and (iii) i.e. NCC/NSS activities, for which he must have passed the qualifying examination from the University of Jammu. The selection under these categories shall be made on the basis of their achievement score in the respective categories to be determined as per relevant statutes governing University admissions. However in case of other reserved categories, the selection shall be made on the basis of inter-se merit in their qualifying examination.

2. Candidates seeking admission to the course under any of the reserved categories must enclose a certificate in the form prescribed for the purpose issued by the competent authority along with his/her admission form. Failure to attach such certificates with admission form will render the applicant ineligible for consideration under the reserved category for admission to the course. Reserved categories certificates on ordinary paper/not signed by the competent authority will not be entertained. The certificate of being a member of SC/ST, Defence Services personnel/Ex-Servicemen, Area adjoining the Actual Line of Control, Backward Area, Weak and under privileged classes shall not be accepted if it has not been issued as per latest order issued by the J&K State Govt. for the purpose. No certificate will be accepted after the submission of the application form for the course.
